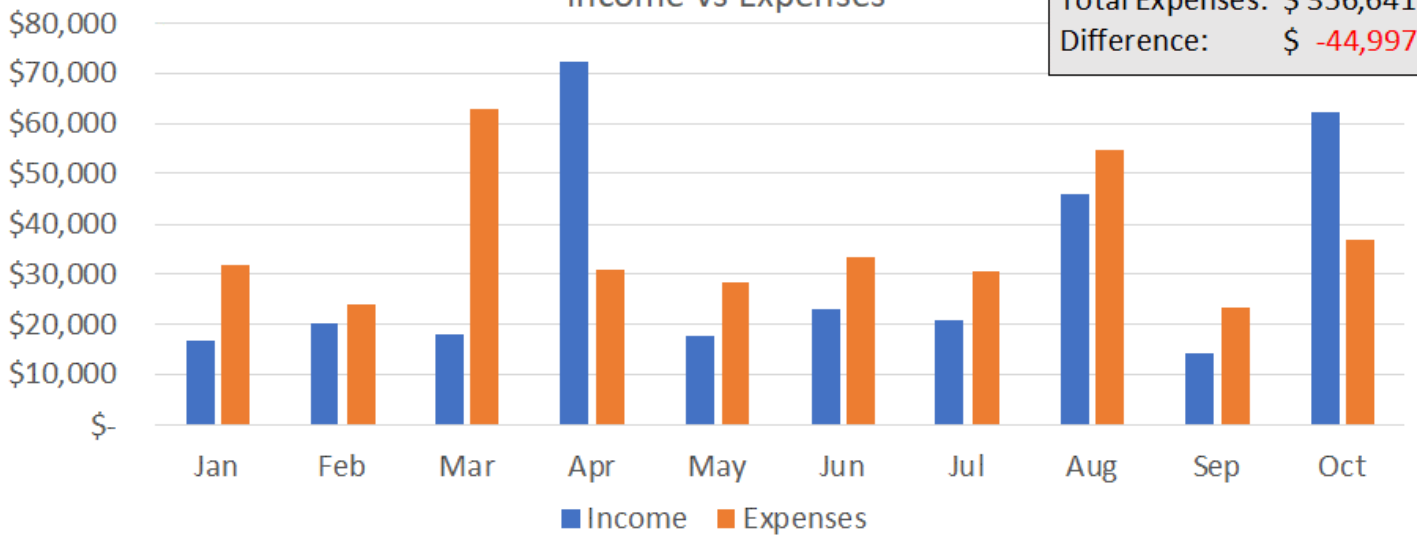

Ink Cartridges

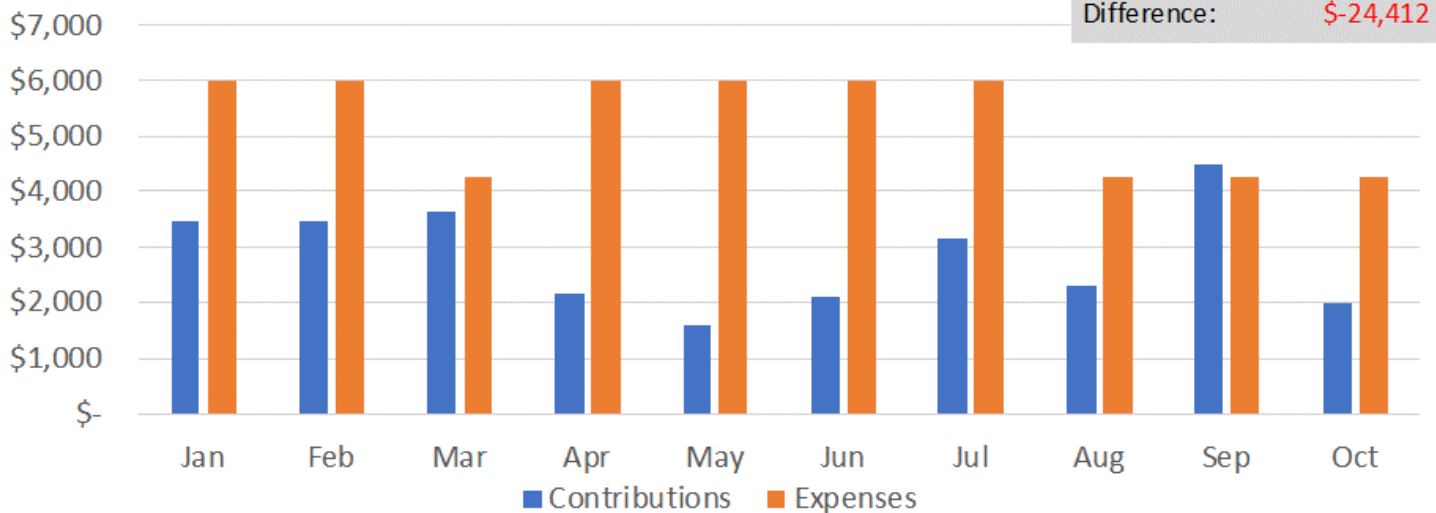

Wants, needs, and the path to contentment *by Pamela Jones*

There is great gain in godliness combined with contentment; for we brought nothing into the world, so that we can take nothing out of it; but if we have food and clothing, we will be content with these. But those who want to be rich fall into temptation and are trapped by many senseless and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. –1 Timothy 6:6-9

I am fascinated by how my children view wants and needs. Every time I take my children shopping to the grocery store, Target, Sam's Club, or the hardware store, I am bombarded with the questions "Can I have that toy?" "or "Can I get a treat?" (I am always surprised by what they think they need from the hardware store!) I spend my shopping trips saying no and despite our frequent conversations about needs and wants, my kids often end up sulking about the perceived injustice of leaving a store without the desired item. I am sure every person who has taken a child shopping has experienced the same thing.

Children and youth are forgiven for confusing *wants* and *needs*, because they are still learning their meaning. However, many people reach adulthood without understanding needs and wants. The distinction is especially hard to learn in our consumer culture, where every advertisement tells us that true happiness is forever *just one more* purchase away. When we believe this lie, we suffer lives of insatiable desire, ever grasping for the *newer*, the *better*, the *larger*, the *more*.

Mature faith and biblical stewardship challenge us to distinguish our *wants* from our *needs*, so that we may find contentment with "enough" — decent housing, healthy food, clean clothing, and reliable transportation. No longer slaves to a desire for more, we are free to enjoy the abundant life that comes from loving relationships with God and family and neighbors. Finding contentment, we open ourselves to the life God intends for us, rich and abundant in love, joy and grace.
