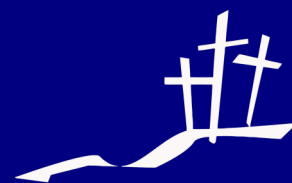

## Pastor David's Doodles

This is a year of transitions for me and for St. Luke's United Methodist church. The thought of retirement, and what that looks like for me, is a big transition time on the horizon. My work life started at age 18 just after my graduation from Central High School in Springfield when I applied and was accepted to begin employment with J.C. Penney at the Battlefield Mall. Throughout the last 57 years, I have been constantly employed even as I have attended college, professional pharmacy school, and during my seminary training for ministry. To plan for this next phase has included lots of "what ifs" that remain a mystery.

To be honest, there are people who have a tough time with transitions. This represents a change or accepting the inevitable and these times are not always on our own terms or by our own doing. For example, the change we go through as a church when a new pastor is appointed to serve our community in July is a tough transition. Emotions seem to take over as we wrap our minds around saying goodbye to each other, all while we are preparing ourselves to welcome and to embrace a new pastor and their ministry.

How we look at transition times in our life determines our eventual comfort or discomfort with the change that always seems to happen in the process. Even our spiritual life undergoes lots of transitions over time. The Bible discusses the idea of transformation as a positive response that can bring our faith into focus.

I was able to break the fall at the last moment by extending my hands and turning my head, but I hit hard. I heard my neck crunch! I lay there for a couple of minutes, until my body told me I was okay. I have a sore face and a heck of a shiner. Nothing broken.

## FEED MY PEOPLE by Suzi Wilhelms

2022 was a busy year for Feed My People serving both our regular clients and those coming in on an emergency basis. For the year we distributed 10,876 food orders feeding 27,798 people, with those people coming in twice monthly. Our TEFAP program served 3,757 families one time per month.

We also provided emergency assistance for 1566 families, which helped feed a total of 4,318 people.

This is only one small part of the programs available at Feed My People and does not include the High Ridge office.

Looking at these numbers makes it easy to understand how much we rely on your generosity to sustain our programs.

## Deceived by ‘the lie of *more*’ by Pamela Jones

*And Jesus said to them, ‘Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one’s life does not consist in the abundance of possessions.’ -Luke 12:15*

“The Smiths” looked uncomfortable as they explained why they couldn’t give more.

“We’d like to,” Mrs. Smith said, “but we’re getting *killed* with bills.” Mr. Smith added, “We barely make ends meet.”

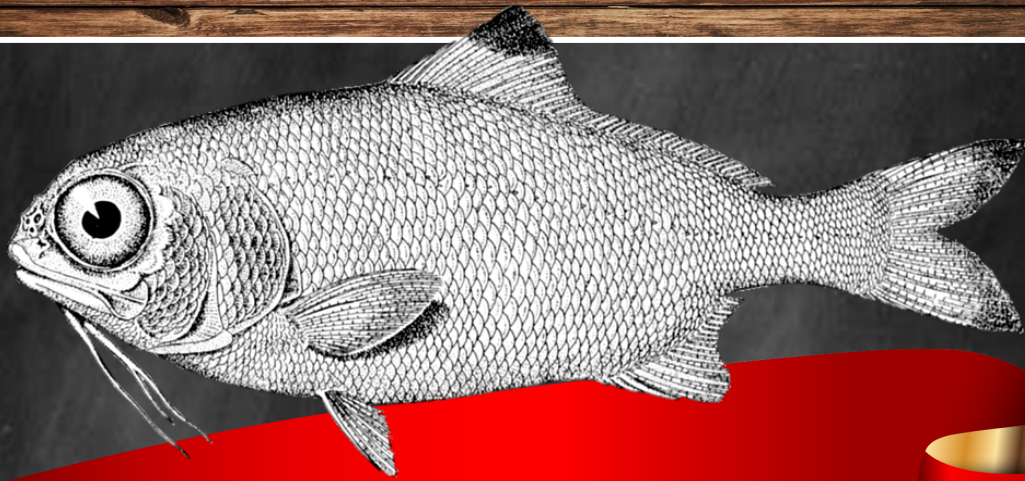
