That same temperature in the summer would cause us to believe we would freeze to death! Being able to adapt and change in order to deal with environmental conditions is important when it comes to weather and equally important when it comes to living our life.

Our world that we live in has changed! Just look at the many changes that a 100-year-old has experienced in their lifetime. A trip across country might have taken three to four days back then, where now we can hop an airplane and do the same distance in just a few short hours. Telephone calls were made on party lines connected by a live operator with a switchboard and now calls can be made from personal smart phones wirelessly to anywhere on the planet. Shopping trips to the old "mom and pop" stores have largely been replaced by on-line retailers offering everything you might want shipped directly to your door. A computer was yet to be invented back then and look at how these devices have changed and impacted our lives now.

Whenever life gets to be a puzzle, I encourage you to persevere through the many challenges and work toward perfection as John Wesley preached. What pieces of your life are yet to be put together? What will it take to complete whatever task that God has placed you on this earth to accomplish? Are you willing to brave a brand new world that changes every day?

When life gets a little overwhelming just remember your foundation in Jesus Christ who is the same yesterday, today, and forever! I find a lot of comfort in this changing world to hold fast to my faith, to know that God loves me even though the puzzle depicting my life is still in the process of being completed. ## Ash Wednesday's wake-up call by Pamela Jones

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

With these words from Genesis 3:19 and the swipe of a dirty thumb across our foreheads, Ash Wednesday propels us into Lent with the proper context to understand our lives as stewards of all that God entrusts to us.

Ash Wednesday, which falls on Feb. 22, teaches us that we are mortals. It crushes our ego, dispels our pretensions, and drives us deep into God's mysteries: Why are we here? What are our lives all about? What's *really* important? Pray over these questions and profound insights emerge.

**We are dust.** Yes, but we are *God's* dust. Our body consists of trillions of atoms, each a speck of "dust" created by God billions of years ago. God put us together from the stuff of the universe.

**We are breath.** We are "dust" into which God has "breathed the Holy breath of life" (Genesis 2:7). Therefore, every breath we take is holy, reminding us of God's life force in us.

**Our time is brief.** Our "dust" will return to the earth someday. We are mortal. Therefore, every hour, every second is sacred. We spend our time wisely, carefully, prayerfully and we do not cling to possessions, knowing that we hold onto them only for a little while.

This Lent, spend time in prayer, with openness and honesty. See how God will turn your heart and mind, transforming you into the person you were created to be.

**ONLINE GIVING JUST GOT EASIER!**

**DID YOU KNOW?** St. Luke's holds the distinction of being the first new Methodist Church to be established in the then, St. Louis District after a period of 25 years of no new church being organized in the District. In 1940 the church officials became aware of the trend of the population shift toward suburban areas. In October 1940, the St. Louis Annual Conference met and a young minister, Rev. Monk Bryan, was transferred from the Central Conference to St. Luke's Methodist Church. The church was, at that point, only a name. All Rev. Bryan was told was that the church was to be located somewhere south of St. Louis City and that his salary would be \$125.00 per month. From His vision, came the beginning of what we know today as St. Luke's United Methodist Church!

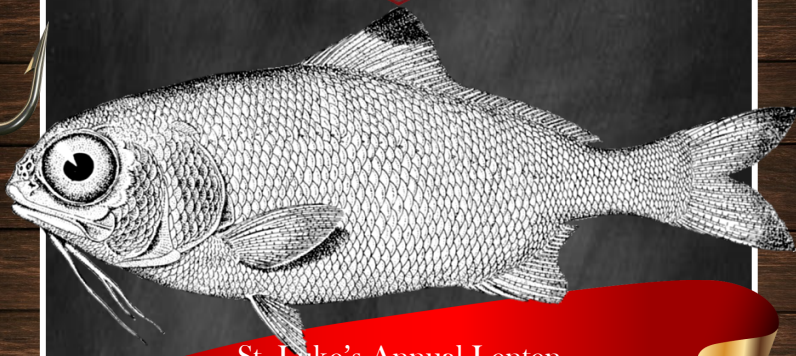
