A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

As your pastor, I'm just getting to know you even though I began my appointment last July. One thing I'm learning: most folks at St. Luke's are unfamiliar with the volunteer leadership structure of the church.

So below I'll describe each of the leadership teams. On the next page of this newsletter are the volunteers who serve on the leadership teams. Volunteer leaders are approved at Charge Conference annually.

The key volunteer leader of the church is the Lay Leader, who is Tammy Caldwell. The Lay Leader is the team leader for the Executive, TSF, and ICS Teams.

The Executive Team is the executive agency of the Charge Conference, making ongoing decisions about budgeting and ministry oversight.

TSF (Trustees, Staff Parish Relations Committee and Finance Team) oversees the care and usage of the church property, the finances of the church, and the liaison responsibilities between the congregation, the district superintendent, the church staff, and the pastor.

The ICS Team (Inviting, Connecting, Sending) organizes ministries to connect the congregation to one another, the community, and our world.

The Nominations Team is chaired by the Pastor and coordinates the slate of volunteer leaders annually.

Ad Hoc Teams formed by the Pastor include: the Stewardship Team, the Safety/Safe Gatherings Team, and the Worship Design Team.

I'm grateful for these faithful leaders and the dedication to God's work at St. Luke's.
